





The Challenge

Over 115 million students globally are not in school; approximately 71 million are high-school aged.

In most countries, secondary school is not free, and for students from the poorest families, the cost of tuition, uniforms and other supplies makes pursuing an education seem impossible. The School Fund allows donors to collectively cover education fees.






The School Fund is a nonprofit online educational funding platform that connects passionate donors globally to ensure that all children—no matter where they live—have the opportunity to attend school.

Through The School Fund, **3,510 unique funders** have contributed **over \$350,000** to support educational scholarships for **1,095 students**.

Focus on Secondary Education



Per United Nations recommendation, many countries like Kenya have abolished *primary* school fees. Nations that have abolished primary school fees have seen an explosion in primary school attendance—but this has not led to transition rates to secondary school.

After primary school, for want of as little as \$150 per year, students are forced to drop out. The School Fund exists to bridge that financial gap for high achieving students who want to continue learning—and we make it possible for ordinary individuals the world over to chip in (and donate **as little as \$5**) toward meeting these needs.



Our Story

In 2007, The School Fund's founder, Matt Severson, graduated high school and traveled to Tanzania where he met John Medo, a bright young boy who had passed secondary school qualifying exams, but whose family couldn't afford his \$150 school fees.

Matt covered John's school fees himself, but upon returning home to the U.S., realized there must be tens of thousands of other John Medos in the world. In fact, there were millions. Matt founded The School Fund in 2009, and in 2012, The School Fund was awarded the **Clinton Global Initiative University Outstanding Commitment Award**. Today, **over 1,000 students**, including John Medo, have received educational support from The School Fund.



Why We Support Education



In low-income countries, only **37%** of adolescents complete lower secondary education, and the rate is as low as **14%** for the lowest income.

For each additional year of secondary school, an individual's wages increase by **15-25%**.

Girls with eight years of education are **four times less likely to be married as children**.

If a mother has five years of education, her children are **40% more likely to live** past the age of 5.

Our Global Reach

The School Fund works with **15 field partners** that address educational inequality with existing ties to communities in **13 countries**.

We support students in Tanzania, Kenya, Uganda, India, Ecuador, Peru, Philippines, Somaliland, Mozambique, Zambia, Sierra Leone, Nepal, and Panama.
